The York Time Institute, located at 312 West Market Street in Historic Downtown York, PA, has been granted a license by the Pennsylvania Department of Education and is now accepting students for its Diploma Program in Watch and Clock Making.

Students in this fifty four week program will graduate with the skills necessary to either open their own business or to work for an established firm in the repair, restoration, and conservation of timepieces. They will also be prepared for employment in related fields requiring the same training in micro and macro technology, such as medical manufacturing and instrument making.

Also offered for the public will be evening and weekend hands-on courses pertaining to timepieces, music boxes and other subjects of interest to watch and clock aficionados. Short courses such as 'Basic Watch and Clock Care', 'Changing Watch Batteries' and specialized classes for young people will be held on a regular basis.

Informative speakers are available for presentations to community organizations, youth groups, historical societies, museums and corporations.

Dan Nied, founder and Director of York Time Institute, a graduate of The Chicago School of Watchmaking and The Gemological Institute of America and former Director of the National Association of Watch and Clock Collectors School of Horology, has been practicing the fine art and science of watch and clock making for over thirty years. In addition to the school, he continues to work on fine timepieces for collectors, museums, and the public. He will be featured on White Rose Community TV with his presentation on his work with the recovery and conservation of the Civil War submarine CSS Hunley.
